### RESPONSE OF THE CALIFORNIA ENERGY STORAGE ALLIANCE TO PACIFIC GAS AND ELECTRIC COMPANY'S (U 39 E) PETITION FOR MODIFICATION OF DECISION 19-08-001

In accordance with the Rules of Practice and Procedure of the California Public Utilities Commission ("Commission"), the California Energy Storage Alliance ("CESA") hereby submits this response to *Pacific Gas and Electric Company's (U 39 E) Petition for Modification of Decision 19-08-001* ("Petition"), submitted by Pacific Gas and Electric Company ("PG&E") on March 11, 2020. Pursuant to the *Email Ruling Shortening Response Period on Petition for Modification of Decision 19-08-001* ("Ruling"), issued by Administrative Law Judge ("ALJ") Cathleen A. Fogel on March 13, 2020, CESA timely submits this response on March 26, 2020.

#### I. <u>RESPONSE</u>.

CESA strongly supports PG&E's Petition to ensure that Medical Baseline ("MB") customers have access to Self-Generation Incentive Program ("SGIP") funds, despite not having access to an SGIP-approved time-of-use ("TOU") rate, as required by Decision ("D.") 19-08-001. The logic for exempting California Alternate Rates for Energy ("CARE") customers can be extended to MB customers as well, as explained by PG&E in its Petition.<sup>1</sup> These changes are reasonable and necessary to support MB customer deployments of energy storage, especially ahead

of the upcoming 2020 wildfire season. Furthermore, PG&E's proposed modifications to the

decision ensure that MB customers in other service territories have similar exemptions apply. As

such, CESA recommends that the Commission grant PG&E's requested relief in its Petition.

II. <u>CONCLUSION</u>.

CESA appreciates the opportunity to submit this response to the Petition and recommends

that the Commission expeditiously grant PG&E's Petition to ensure timely access to SGIP

incentives for MB customers.
